

 - Naaman: commander of Aram's forces; healed of leprosy by Elisha
 - Jehu: anointed king of Israel by Elisha

- Cast of Characters:
 - Isaiah: one of the greatest prophets of the Bible
 - Nebuchadnezzar: king of Babylon; destroys Jerusalem and enslaves its people
 - Jehoiachin: king of Judah; rules under license from Babylon

- Where is the work of Christ?
 - 2 Kings presents the ministries of Elijah and Elisha, prophets through whom God performed mighty acts. Jesus is described as "a Prophet powerful in action and speech before God and all the people". (Luke 24:19)

- Interesting Facts:
 - There was a Queen who reigned in 2 Kings 11 for 6 years. Her name was Athaliah, and is widely believed to be the daughter of Ahab and Jezebel.
 - Josiah was not only one of the best kings; he was the youngest at 8 years old, and reigned for 31 years. (2 Kings 22:1)
