**Interesting Facts:** 1. Nebuchadnezzar’s first invasion into Judah occurred in his first year, 605 B.C.

- He deported some 10,000 captives from the Jerusalem area to Babylon, some 900 miles away.
- Included in the first group of captives were: Daniel, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego
