Interesting Facts:

- 1.) Isaiah lived in Jerusalem but did not restrict his prophecies to that city. He also warned of God’s intentions towards Babylon (13, 14), Assyria (14), the Philistines (14), Cush, Moab (15, 16), Egypt (19, 20), Damascus, and others.
- 2.) Isaiah includes four _____ Songs, with the fourth called the Suffering Servant. (42:1-4; 49:1-6; 50:4-9; 53:13-53:12)
- 3.) The book of Isaiah is like a miniature _____; the first 39 chapters resemble the Old Testament with judgment upon man, and the final 27 chapters resemble the New Testament declaring a message of hope.
