- Interesting Facts:**
1. Luke is the longest of the four Gospels, and gives the most complete account of Christ’s ancestry, birth, and development.
 - Luke traces Jesus’ ancestry back to Adam.
 2. The first thirty years of Jesus’ life is summed up in one verse, Luke 2:52 - “*And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man.*”
 3. According to tradition, Luke remained unmarried and died at the age of 84.
