- ◎ Who wrote it?
 - It is anonymous, but scholars agree that Luke wrote both this Gospel and Acts.
 - Luke was a Gentile Christian who was a physician and companion of Paul on his missionary journeys. (Col. 4:14, 2 Tim. 4:11, Philemon 1:24)

◉ Timing of Events:

- 4 B.C. to A.D. 33
- Luke is the most comprehensive Gospel.
- Luke highlights Jesus' journey from Galilee to Jerusalem; known as the "travelogue" (9:51 to 19:27).

THE GOSPEL OF LUKE

◎ Cast of Characters:

- **God:** walks the earth as a man
- **Jesus:** His life, works, and resurrection
- **Theophilus:** unknown person for whom Luke records the life of Jesus
- **Zacharias, Elisabeth:** their son, John, is sent to prepare the way for Christ
- **The shepherds:** first to hear of Jesus' birth
- **A sinful woman:** washes Jesus' feet with her tears
- **Mary Magdalene:** had seven demons cast out of her

THE GOSPEL OF LUKE

◎ Interesting Facts:

- Luke is the longest of the four Gospels, and gives the most complete account of Christ's ancestry, birth, and development.
 - Luke traces Jesus' ancestry back to Adam.
- The first thirty years of Jesus' life is summed up in one verse, Luke 2:52 - "*And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man.*"
- According to tradition, Luke remained unmarried and died at the age of 84.
