**Interesting Facts:**

1. More than 130 times Matthew uses quotations and allusions to the Old Testament to show that Jesus fulfills the qualifications for the Messiah.
2. Matthew often uses the phrase, “that which was spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled.” This phrase does not appear once in Mark, Luke, or John.
3. The Book of Matthew is placed first in the New Testament because of its natural bridge between the Old and New Testaments.
