**Where is Christ?** Micah repeats (4:1-5) Israel’s Messianic \_\_\_\_\_ (2:2-4), focusing on the exaltation of God’s temple as a worship place for all \_\_\_\_\_, and on the end of war. Israel will walk in the name of the Lord (4:5). This is possible because God will once again visit David’s birthplace in Bethlehem and bring forth a new, everlasting King (5:2-5 and Mt. 2:6)

- Interesting Facts:** 1. Judah’s specific sins included:
- Oppression
  - Bribery among judges, prophets, and priests
  - Exploitation of the powerless
  - Covetousness
  - Cheating – Merchants used deceptive weights
  - Pride
